On one of the trips, Keala took on the task of cleaning a particularly overgrown banana patch. She had done an excellent job and was told to take a break. She refused to stop and kept going. Even after I said what she had sone was sufficient enough, she kept going. She knew that this would have made the patient extremely happy and that was what kept her going.

What is it that drives you in your work? Do you have the mindset of "good enough is good enough"? In other words, do you do it to just passing standards? Or do you give it your all? When it comes to doing God's work, it's important for us to keep going even if we may not see the rewards just yet. As our scripture tells us, we will reap it in due time. In addition, our motivation should be that we are doing it for God.

Colossians 3:23 tells us, "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord and not for people." I love that word *heartily*. It means wholeheartedly, enthusiastically.
